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## Acute Respiratory Infection (Novel Coronavirus 2019-nCov) Important Information

It is government policy in Ontario that health care providers working at Ontario clinical sites **refrain from coming in to work** should they present symptoms that may be attributable to a person-to-person transmittable acute infection. This includes any of the following symptoms, which may be attributable to acute respiratory infection:

- fever
- cough
- shortness of breath
- other respiratory symptoms

While the risk of Novel Coronavirus 2019-nCov in healthcare workers with recent travel to affected areas\* is very low, it is important that all countries take a precautionary approach to this serious virus. As such, it is imperative that learners monitor themselves for symptoms which are compatible with acute respiratory infection, and that they report any such symptoms immediately, should they emerge.

If you develop symptoms of an acute respiratory infection within 14 days of arriving or returning to Canada:

- **Stay home.** Do not present for work at your clinical site.
- **Advise your supervisor and Academy Director** by phone or e-mail that you must remain at home, and that you will be following the directives of the hospital's Infection Control Team.
- They will advise as to next steps.

Please be aware that even if asymptomatic, you may be screened at the Occupational Health Office of your clinical site. If you have travelled to an affected area or have been in close contact with someone who is symptomatic and has travelled to an affected area within the last 14 days, you may not be permitted to proceed with clinical activities.
